Providing school uniform, face masks and other school requirement to needy children

Since 2008, YAWOSUP has been supporting needy children in Yala Division through provision of basic needs like school fees, uniform and writing materials among others.

This has been only possible through the support we get from our Partners. We thank God for WMT that has enabled us to support the needy through our community outreach programs. Many widows and orphans have benefited a lot through the support. During the climax of Covid 19 infection when lockdown was imposed on us, we got a lot of support from WMT and Rehema Trust.

This included relief food, hand sanitizers, learning gadgets, which enabled our children to do online learning among many others. This improved learning competency among our children. With the outbreak of COVID 19, it was

compulsory for all children to wear facemasks to prevent further spread of the disease. Some of the children could not afford the commodity. With the help of our partners, we have been able to support such children with facemasks that allowed them to remain at school.

We thank God for WMT and Rehema trust for their generosity at this difficult moment it time. With prayers and consideration of health protocols, we have seen tremendous improvement in the reduction of infection rate in Kenya and more so among young people. We hope that things will come back to normal soon and there will be no need for wearing facemasks. We understand that it has been very hard for children to wear masks throughout the day and so it is our prayer that things go back to normalcy.

#### YAWOSUP FARM

We thank God for the funds we received this year to support our food security program. This fund enabled us to rent one and a half acres of land, plough and purchase farm input. The farm has been cultivated and is now waiting for rains. The rain is expected any time from now. Some of the strong widows will be working in the farm with the help of some hired laborers to ensure that the maize and vegetables are planted in good time.
